



RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF PETALUMA CITY SCHOOLS ELEMENTARY DISTRICT ("PETALUMA CITY SCHOOLS"), TO DETERMINE THE SUFFICIENCY OF TEXTBOOKS OR INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS.

WHEREAS, the governing board of Petaluma City Schools, in order to comply with the requirements of Education Code Section 60119 held a public hearing on September 15, 2026,, at 6:00 p.m., which is on or before the eighth week of school and which did not take place during or immediately following school hours, and;

WHEREAS, the governing board provided at least 10 days' notice of the public hearing posted in at least three public places within the district that stated the time, place, and purpose of the hearing, and;

WHEREAS, the governing board encouraged participation by parents, teachers, members of the community, and bargaining unit leaders in the public hearing, and;

WHEREAS, information provided at the public hearing and to the governing board at the public meeting detailed the extent to which textbooks and instructional materials were provided to all students, including English learners, in the district/county office of education, and

WHEREAS, the definition of "sufficient textbooks or instructional materials" means that each pupil has a textbook or instructional materials, or both, to use in class and to take home, and;

WHEREAS, between the 2008-09 through the 2026-27 fiscal years, the definition of "sufficient textbooks or instructional materials" also means that all students who are enrolled in the same course within the Petaluma City Elementary District have standards-aligned textbooks or instructional materials from the same adoption cycle, and;

WHEREAS, sufficient textbooks and instructional materials were provided to each student, including English learners, that are aligned to the academic content standards and consistent with the cycles and content of the curriculum frameworks in the following subjects:

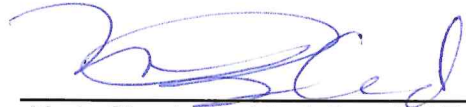
- Mathematics
- Science
- History-social science
- English/language arts, including the English language development component of an adopted program

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that for the 2026-27 school year, the Petaluma City Schools Elementary has provided each pupil with sufficient textbooks and instructional materials aligned to the academic content standards and consistent with the cycles and content of the curriculum frameworks.
