Why Community College?




Why Community College?

- ❖ 116 Campuses across California
- ❖ Low tuition cost; often free
- ❖ Open to everyone - no admission requirements
- ❖ Small class sizes
- ❖ 100's of Certificate Programs (skill building)
- ❖ Career Education (CE) and Apprenticeship (paid job training) Programs

- ❖ Earn an Associates (AA/AS) Degree
- ❖ Guaranteed transfer to: CSU (Transfer Success Pathway), UC (transfer agreements), private, or out of state by earning General Education credits

Transfer Requirements to Know

- ❖ Transfer after 60 lower-division transferable units
- ❖ Courses must be UC/CSU transferable (check: [Assist.org](https://assist.org))
- ❖ Complete general education + major prep
- ❖ Major requirements vary by college and major
- ❖ Planning early with a college counselor is key
