

Save \$\$\$ (low tuition, and often free)



CA COMMUNITY COLLEGES

- × Open to everyone no admission requirements
- × Smaller class sizes
- × Large number of Certificate Programs (skill building)
- <u>Career Education</u> (CE) and <u>Apprenticeship</u> (paid job training)
 Programs <u><video link></u>
- × Earn an Associates (AA/AS) Degree
- Transfer to: <u>CSU (Transfer Success Pathway)</u>, <u>UC (transfer agreements</u>), private, or out of state by earning <u>General Education</u> credits

MINIMUM ELIGIBILITY:

- × A-G Requirements
- × 2.5 Minimum GPA
- × NO SAT/ACT
- × The more A-Gs taken, the better
- Some majors require specific math or science courses in high school



9 UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA CAMPUSES

ELIGIBILITY:

A-G Requirements - must go beyond the minimum

3.0 Minimum GPA

NO SAT/ACT

Top 9% based on your A-G GPA

13 comprehensive factors



With the elimination of SAT/ACT for CSU/UC and other universities, they are giving more weight to the number of A-G courses you take beyond the minimum requirements.

Consider taking ...

- 4 years of math and science
- 3 or 4 years of LOTE
- AP/Honorsclasses
- Community college courses

SAT/ACT ?!

- ★ Many Ivy League Universities, MIT, and some other private/out of state universities are bringing back the SAT/ACT requirement for admissions
- ★ Will you need to take the SAT/ACT to be able to apply to the university of your choice?
 - SAT Test dates May 3 (**April 18), June 7 (**May 22), Aug/Oct/Nov/Dec fall dates
 - ACT Test dates June (**May 8), July 11 (**June 24), Sept/Oct/Dec fall dates







JUNIOR Year & beginning of SENIOR Year:

- o Verify accuracy of your high school transcript. Are you meeting graduation requirements? A thru G requirements? NCAA core requirements?
- Explore your interests at www.cacareerzone.org or www.californiacolleges.edu. Define what you want to do for a career and what education you need.
- <u>Explore the educational pathways</u>. Do you want to earn a <u>technical certificate</u>? A bachelor's degree or higher? Is on-the-job training via paid <u>apprenticeship</u> the right path for you? How about <u>free job training</u>?
- o Explore and select college major(s). A major is your primary subject area of interest in college. It does not have to be your future job. Make sure that colleges offer what you want to study. Some colleges require that you declare a major when you apply.
- o Create your own college ranking. Use different resources to research colleges that fit your needs. Create a comparison worksheet. Narrow down your list to include dream schools, reach schools, and safe schools. Chat with college reps through Casa's College & Career Center.
- Register with the NCAA at eligibilitycenter.org if planning to play D-I or D-II sports. Send your SAT and ACT scores to NCAA. Code for SAT is 9999.
