

#### CGHS College Planning Checklist 2024-25

- Verify accuracy of your high school transcript. Are you meeting graduation requirements? A thru G requirements? NCAA core requirements?
- Explore your interests at www.cacareerzone.org or www.californiacolleges.edu. Define what you want to do for a career and what education you need.
- Explore the educational pathways. Do you want to earn a technical or career certification? A bachelors degree or higher? Is on-the-job training via paid apprenticeship the right path for you? How about free job training?
- Explore and select college major(s). A major is your primary subject area of interest in college. It does not have to be your future job. Make sure that colleges offer what you want to study. Some colleges require that you declare a major when you apply. Most allow you to apply with an undeclared major.
- o Create your own college ranking. Use different resources to research, colleges that fit your needs. Use a comparison worksheet template. Narrow down your list to include dream schools, reach schools, and safe schools. Chat with college reps through Casa's College & Career Center.
- Register with the NCAA at eligibilitycenter.org if planning to play D-I or D-II sports, NCAA no longer requires SAT or ACT scores

- Register for the SAT or ACT only if needed. CSUs and UCs no longer accept SAT or ACT scores for admissions. Most other schools are test-optional. If you decide to test, it should be completed by December of Senior year. Some prefer scores by November: Ask your counselor if you qualify for a fee
- Attend Senior Overview Night for students and parents: Oct. 8th @ 6:30pm in the Multi.
- o CSU filing period Oct. 1 Nov. 30 Apply EARLY before Thanksgiving is strongly recommended. oUC filing period Oct. 1 - Nov. 30 Apply EARLY - before Thanksgiving is strongly recommended.
- alf you need Letters of Recommendation for Common App, scholarships, etc., then complete the LOR Profile. Offer it to adults if they agree to write a letter for you. Request letters at least four weeks in advance.
- Request transcripts for colleges, scholarships, honor
- November of SENIOR Year:

o Submit CSU and UC college applications by Nov. 30th

#### December of SENIOR Year:

- o\$\$\$ FAFSA and Dream Act filing period begins Dec 1. Financial aid is first come, first served.
- o\$\$\$SRJC: APPLY for the Dovle Scholarship by completing the EAESA or Cal Dream Act game

## What about Al?



#### Al writing tools

If used thoughtfully, Al tools might assist in the early stages of the writing process. But students should ensure that their responses are entirely their own in voice, substance, and reflection.

#### **WARNING**

It is possible that these tools may pull content from other sources (i.e., plagiarized content) which can result in application cancellation due to plagiarism.

The UC system runs plagiarism checks and will disqualify students from **ALL** nine campuses **FOR LIFE** if they detect Al-generated content.

# Freshman: Admission Requirements

The California State University (CSU) no longer uses ACT or SAT examinations in determining admission eligibility for all CSU campuses. If accepted to a CSU campus, ACT or SAT test scores can be used as one of the measures to place students in the proper mathematics and written communication courses. Visit the CSU Student Success site for further information on course placement. For more information on admission criteria, please visit the First-Time Freshman Guidance and the First-Time Freshman Frequently Asked Questions pages.



#### Exam requirement

UC will not consider SAT or ACT test scores when making admissions decisions or awarding scholarships. If you choose to submit test scores as part of your application, they may be used as an alternative method of fulfilling minimum requirements for eligibility or for course placement after you enroll.







### FAFSA vs. CADAA



<u>FAFSA</u> = Free Application for Federal Student Aid

You're eligible to complete the FAFSA if you are a:

- US Citizen
- Permanent Resident
- Eligible Non-Citizen
- T-Visa Holder



<u>CADAA</u> = California Dream Act Application

You're eligible to complete the CADAA if you:

- Are Undocumented
- Have a Valid or Expired DACA status
- Are a U-Visa Holder
- Have Temporary Protected Status (TPS)
- Meet the Non-Resident Exemption Requirements Under AB540


- FAFSA & CADAA applications use income data from 2024
- Students/Families filling out the FAFSA can use the IRS (Internal Revenue Service) Tax Data Retrieval Tool
  - The 2024 income info needed will be transferred directly & securely from the IRS to the FAFSA
- Priority application is March 2, 2026 APPLY EARLY!
- Financial Aid applications are used to calculate Financial Need

#### **EXAMPLES**



Communication Ethnic Studies + Many More





- 2.00-2.49 A-G GPA's may be evaluated for admission based upon supplemental factors. Each campus will determine the supplemental factors and communicate these to students.

## COMMUNITY COLLEGE TRANSFER PATH

- Sometimes it is free depending on where you reside/attend
- Complete your GE courses for less \$\$
- Explore majors/careers before transferring
- A fresh start! Your HS academic record won't be used when you transfer
- CC course credits can be transferred to a 4-year
- You need to complete 60 <u>transfer</u> units to be eligible to transfer!
- Typically complete some General Education Courses + any pre-req's for desired major
- Transfer requirements vary by 4-year

- For students who are U.S. Citizens, Legal permanent residents, and individuals with granted asylum
- Opens October 1st
- Closes March 3rd



#### **CA DREAM ACT**

- CA Dream Act website dream.csac.ca.gov
- Access to State Aid only
- For students who are AB540. Including students who are undocumented, or those who have a Social Security Number (SSN) because of DACA/TPS/U-Visa
- Opens October 1st
- Closes March 3rd

Only apply to FAFSA OR the CA Dream Act, but never both!





#### YOU HAVE TO APPLY EVERY YEAR

You have to complete a financial aid application every year to maintain eligibility!
