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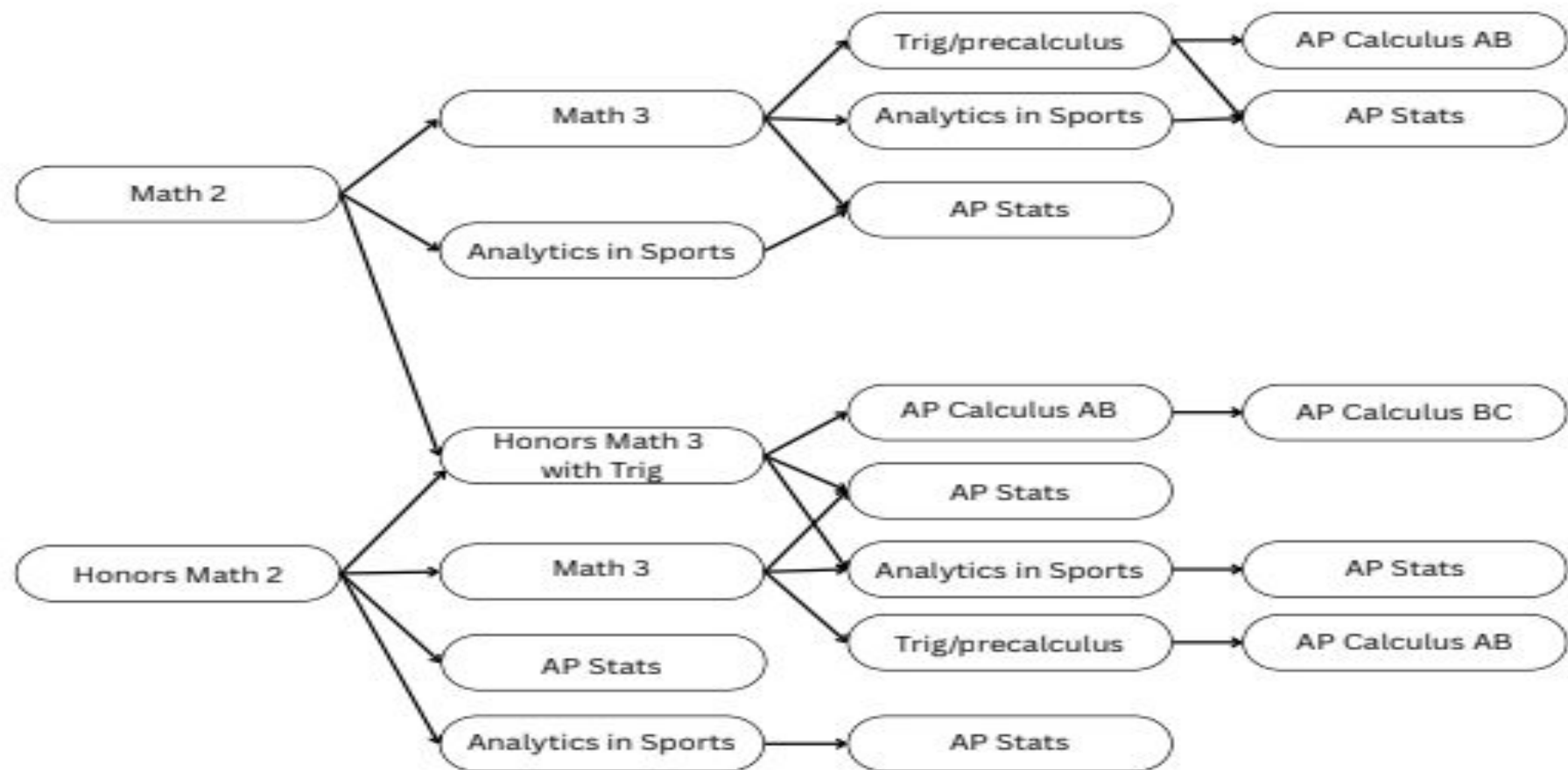

GRADES RECOMMENDED TO ADVANCE IN CLASSES

- Grade of C or higher in **Math 1** to move into **Math 2**
- Grade of C or higher in level 1 **world language** to enter level 2 world language.
- Grade of B or higher in level 2 to enter level 3 honors **world language**.

CREDIT RECOVERY

- Summer School
- Repeat the course

HONORS & AP COURSES

- Greater rigor, more topics and/or more in-depth work at a faster pace
- Exposed to more challenging material
- Honors prepares for AP classes
- Consult your current teachers
- GPA weighted for Honors ~ Math 3, Chemistry, French 3 and Spanish 3, Spanish for Spanish Speakers 3, World History, English 10, and all AP courses.
- Higher AP Exam scores = College credit


