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COMMUNITY CHARACTERISTICS

- Petaluma City Schools serves the city of Petaluma and surrounding areas.
- Petaluma is a city of approximately 62,000 in southern Sonoma County. Service industries, high tech companies, and agriculture are large employers in the local economy.
- The district consists of two comprehensive high schools, two junior high schools and seven elementary schools.
- The student population is 60.78% White, 30.94% Hispanic, 1.01% American Indian, 1.44% Asian, 1.01% African American, .25% Pacific Islander, .08% Filipino and 4.48% Multi-Ethnic.

SCHOOL CHARACTERISTICS

- Petaluma High is a comprehensive four-year public high school enrolling 1,214 students in grades 9 through 12.
- The school opened in 1873 making it one of the oldest schools in California.
- Petaluma High School has been at its current site since the 1940s, with major renovations in 1995, 2003, 2008, 2014, and 2017 including the construction of an Arts and Media Building and renovation of our pool area and gymnasium.

CURRICULUM

- The academic program is organized on a fixed schedule with all classes on C days and alternating A/B days, where students take 4 classes on A days and 3 on B days; B days occur twice weekly and include a one-hour advisory.
- Students may participate in career pathway programs in eight Industry Sectors: Sustainable Agriculture; Agriculture Mechanics; Business & Finance; Design, Media, & Visual Art; Manufacturing & Design; Animal Science; Medical Science; and Transportation.
- Petaluma High School offers 19 AP courses and 6 Honors courses.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Two hundred twenty (220) credits, as shown below, are required for a high school diploma. Each class receives 5 credits per semester.
